



AROUND OUR PARISH, THE DIOCESE AND WORLD



GREETINGS! THE LORD BE WITH YOU ALL.

I hope this last week was as spiritually profound for you as it was for me. The readings in daily Mass were so real, so able to speak to us, and then we came to All Saints and All Souls and the call to live our lives for our true home. heaven. Deacon Ken led a beautifully prayerful Remembrance Service Friday evening for all of us who had lost

someone this year. And we ended the **REMEMBER: WITNESS TO HOPE IS A** Commandment. We UPON RENOVATIONS WILL BE DONE were challenged to

Listen, to Hear, and to know that our God is One there is no other. (We tend to make so many things so much more important as if they become our gods). He is Lord alone. And we should love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our mind, and with all our strength. And we should love our neighbor as ourselves. Well, I still feel the impact of the week before. I hope this week, God will continue to lead us so we may finish this year full of the Holy Spirit and Grace—just three weeks until we renew our journey with Advent.

To be focused in a spiritual way, to be intentional Disciples, makes all the difference as we live this life now in this world. We see that in the way that Holy Redeemer experiences so much grace, a sense of the presence of the Holy Spirit, with full active participation through the whole Mass, and a sense of community that makes people feel welcome. A visitor told me last week at the 11am Mass that he has never seen so many people participate so actively in the Mass, not just with singing but with the prayers, and an openness to God and one another. We also see a difference in the way Holy Redeemer is generous in taking care of our parish, the poor in our community, and our generous response to our Bishop when asked. Recently, our Bishop asked us to support his Witness to Hope campaign and your response was again,

generous. We have included an insert in today's bulletin with an update based on a quarterly report that came to us from the Diocese of Lansing on

October 1, 2018.

Five Hundred and five people/families from Holy Redeemer responded as a Community of Intentional Disciples and pledged \$1,132,374.57 (our goal set by the Diocese was \$1,088,336). That was nothing short of impressive and truly faithful. Remember thirty-five percent of what we actually give comes back to Holy Redeemer to do important work at our parish. According to the quarterly report,

Holy Redeemer parishioners have paid week last Sunday FIVE YEAR COMMITMENT. AS THE \$449,112.67 to date on with the Greatest FUNDS ARE AVAILABLE, AGREED their five year pledge. Currently in Witness to Hope

> savings account we have accrued \$146,374.96 to begin working on the important needs and projects we shared with you on the Witness to Hope brochure. Some of these were much needed projects that have already been done because of the critical nature of the need to do them immediately (like a leaky roof).

> Did you know we have already put a new roof on the Family Life Center last month at a cost of \$64,000? Did you know we sealed and tuck pointed the Southwestern wall of our Church Building at a cost of \$4,000? This will give us time to collect more funds and repair the wall next year at an estimated cost of \$90,000. Finance Council has given approval to refinish the pews in the Church Building beginning immediately after this Easter at a cost of \$100,000. With many of the kneelers falling apart, we are way overdue on this project that will maintain and keep our beautiful Church safe.

> Other projects we plan to do within this five year period are improvements to the beauty and dignity of the Adoration Chapel, improvements to the interior of the Family Life Center wall paper and paint, ceiling tiles, and lighting; and improvements to the office space. All of these were on the original Witness to Hope parish plan. Remember we have committed to pay cash on all our projects and we will never put the parish in any

We'll be going over our theme for December as well as the special programs for Christmas and advent including our annual Christmas pageant during the 4pm Christmas Mass.


