We had 39 ladies in attendance, including several of our new members. Thank you to Joan Clark for serving delicious chicken bruschetta and potatoes for our main dish. We also want to thank everyone who brought stuffed animals for us to donate to Hurley Children's Hospital, for use in the pediatric ER and on the floor.

Our meeting was another productive and busy one. We heard pro-life reports from Julie Grandquist, highlighting some of the national legal updates on pro-life issues. We discussed Bark.us, an app that can be placed on electronic devices to help block pornographic sites, and prayed against human trafficking. We talked about some treasury report changes regarding the closet. We discussed the Lenten retreat and found new chairs for next year. We also covered February Bake Sale, Scholarship, Euchre Tournament, Fashion Show, Day Trip to Our Lady of the Woods, Fr. Steve's Retirement, Lenten Series Meal, HR Family Fun Day, Welcome Event for the new priest, and our monthly donations. We also talked about doubling the size of our bulletin ad, setting up a day of prayer for our new priest, and had requests for help for both the home Communion the funeral luncheon programs. # **MONTHLY DONATIONS**

I forgot to provide an update at the March meeting about our collection in February for the St. John Vianney School fundraiser. We collected a total of \$496, which was matched by an outside donor for their program. Thank you all for your generosity. I also finally heard from Deacon Omar through Outreach (our February donation) about a family he suggested, where the husband had his hours at work severely cut. We discussed this at the March meeting and,

given the strength of our finances, we voted to give \$500 to Outreach to support this family. For our March donations, we opened up the floor for suggestions and decided on 2--we voted to give \$250 to the Knights of Columbus for their sleeping bag/backpacks for the homeless (\$125 each), and we donated \$250 plus the GoFundMe fee for an account for Josh Stately, a Powers graduate and MSU student who was injured in the recent shooting.
