# PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Hi ladies! What a great meeting to start our year! We had 43 ladies in attendance--so wonderful to see everyone! We enjoyed another delicious potluck with Swedish meatballs, potatoes, and stuffing prepared by Lorraine Nemecek, Karen Thornton, and Greg Gach (thank you all!). Another big thank you to everyone who donated items for Holy Rosary School, it's wonderful to see our group's generosity! We had a productive meeting that moved along smoothly and covered a lot of topics. We talked about upcoming Bake Sale, Euchre Tournament, Dinner Auction, welcome event for Fr. Georges, Scrapbooking, Pat Paris Scholarship, Regional CCW meeting, and some of our ideas for the upcoming year. We passed our tabled motion to cover the cost of replating the monstrance and decided to send our September \$100 donation to the Michigan School for the Deaf. I'm very excited to get all of our activities going and have another great year!

# **MOTION/VOTING PROCEDURES**

Our parliamentarian Lorraine Nemecek spoke briefly at our meeting to give us a review of motion and voting procedures as written in our bylaws, so that we make sure that we have funds to cover the things that we want to allocate our money for. If someone wants to make a motion for an expenditure, they need to review the budget (provided on the tables at every meeting) and designate what fund that they would like to see the cost of said expenditure come from. In particular, the cost for replating the monstrance was a large amount and we didn't specify a certain budget to cover this. While we have adequate funds in our bank account to cover expenditures, these funds are divided into different line items to assure we can cover our regular expenses (wine/wafers every month, postage for correspondence, closet needs, etc). If a motion is brought forward for an amount that exceeds a line item budget, it is deemed improper and must be withdrawn or amended for an amount within the budget. Motions over \$500 will always be tabled until the next meeting, but discussion can be had at that meeting. These motions will always be voted on by paper ballot. Motions for less than \$500 are

usually handled by voice vote, but a member making such a motion can request a paper ballot vote at any time. As always, any requests for expenditures should give preference to the sanctuary/altar-related expenses. Requests for funds from non-members should first be brought to the attention of the President. A representative from that group should be present at our meeting to discuss their request and answer any questions the members may have. The vote for such a request will be conducted by paper ballot, and will occur after the representative has left the meeting. We will try to make sure to have a copy of these rules present on the tables at each meeting for clarification. If you have any questions, please contact Lorraine Nemecek.
