AROUND OUR PARISH, THE DIOCESE AND WORLD



GREETINGS FELLOW DISCIPLES OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST,

Well, as you know, we have begun a new series a couple of weeks ago that, in a very practical way, shows us how we can grow in both our understanding and daily practice of being disciples of Jesus. We call the new series STEPS. Each letter of the word STEPS represents one of the five steps to walking as a faithful disciple of Jesus. S-Service, T-Tithe, E-Engaged, P-Prayer and Sacraments, S -Sharing and Inviting people to join us. The first week Father Bob McGraw shared how we are called to service. Last week I was able to share how and why we tithe and how it literally changes the look of a parish and even a diocese. This week we take another step which we call "Engage."

There are many ways followers of Jesus get engaged and become active and intentional disciples. One of the ways the Holy Spirit is moving today in the life of parishes around the country is for people to grow in their discipleship through engaging in "small groups." Many of our parishioners at Holy Redeemer are already "engaged" in small groups. I have done Bible studies and will offer another Bible study on the Gospel of John this fall beginning October 11. I also am part of a small group that meets in the home of a parishioner. We have about 8 people in our small group and our discussions are really thought provoking, fun, and we have developed some good relationships too.

Other examples of ways to be in a small group would be to join Alpha, or Divine Mercy, Bible Study, CRHP which is called Welcome now, Cursillo, RCIA, or one of the small groups that already exist, or start a small group among your friends. Alpha and Welcome are larger groups that break into small table groups that in turn will often spontaneously continue to meet throughout the years. In all these ways, our parishioners "engaging" in a way that builds relationships, prayer, study, and overall growth in our spiritual lives. Some of these groups meet weekly and some monthly; some are women's groups, some are men's groups, some are couples, some are open to anyone, some are young adult, some are mixed but all are some of the wonderful ways the Holy Spirit is helping us walk together and grow together.

Watch for the opportunity to sign up this week to more actively "engage" in faithful discipleship through small groups.




