Why do you think that God, through the Church, obliges the faithful to attend Mass every Sunday rather than simply spending personal time in prayer at home?

As the Catechism illustrates, true leisure is more than just an absence of work; it is a time to "cultivate familial, cultural, social, and religious lives" (CCC 2184).

Why do you think that spending time on these things is so important for Christians?

Prayer, leisure, and service are to be the foundation of the Christian's practice of keeping the Lord's Day. Other than Mass attendance, what is one thing you can do to ensure that Sunday is different than the rest of the week?
